PASTOR'S CORNER

**"If anyone wishes to be great,

Jesus calls us to worship at His altar... self-sacrifice, discipline, and self-denial all culminate on the Cross. There lies the formula for greatness, through which we will find true happiness.

Secular society views faith as some kind of disease to be eradicated, or as a vice rather than a virtue. There lies our challenge to rediscover what Pope Benedict called "the joy of believing." Like Jesus, may we learn to cooperate with the loving energy of God.

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which people who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith can attend classes and have the opportunity to become members of the Catholic Church.

RCIA is for adults who:

- Are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith
- Have never been baptized
- Have been baptized in another Christian faith and are interested in the Catholic faith
- Are baptized Catholics who have not yet received Sacraments of First Communion & Confirmation
- Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass, and would like to take the next steps to become a member of the Catholic Church

RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning in October and ending with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. RCIA classes are taught by Father Murray and are held every Monday evening from 7:00-8:30pm at the rectory. These classes are for anyone with interest, no matter your current denomination. AN EXCELLENT POINT

This is for those of us that remember those days and for those that only heard about those days.

In the line at the store, the cashier told the older woman that plastic bags weren't good for the environment. The woman apologized to her, and explained that she didn't have the "green thing" back in her day.

The clerk responded, "That's our problem today; the former generation did not care enough to save our environment." He was right, that generation did not have the "green thing" in its day.

Back then, they returned their milk bottles, soda bottles and beer bottles to the store. The store sent them back to the plant to be washed and sterilized and refilled, using the same bottles over and over. So, they really were recycled.

But they didn't have the "green thing" back in that customer's day.

In her day, they walked up the stairs, because they didn't have an escalator in every store and office building. They walked to the grocery store and didn't climb into a 300-horsepower machine every time they had to go a few blocks.

But she's right. They didn't have the "green thing" in her day.

Back then, they washed the baby's diapers because they didn't have the disposable kind. They dried clothes on a line, not in an energy-gobbling machine burning up 220 volts; wind and solar power really did dry the clothes. Kids got hand-me-down clothes from their siblings, not always brand new clothing.

But that old lady is right; they didn't have the "green thing" back in her day.

Back then, they had one TV or radio in the house, not a TV in every room. And the TV had a small screen the size of a handkerchief, not a screen the size of the state of Montana. In the kitchen, they blended and stirred by hand because they didn't have electric machines to do everything for you. When they packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, they used wadded-up newspaper to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble wrap.

Back then, they didn't fire up an engine and burn gasoline just to cut the lawn. They used a push mower that ran on human power. They exercised by working so they didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity.

But she's right...they didn't have the "green thing" back then.

They drank from a fountain when they were thirsty, instead of using a cup or a plastic bottle every time they had a drink of water. They refilled pens with ink, instead of buying a new pen, and they replaced the razor blades in a razor instead of throwing away the whole razor just because the blade got dull.

But they didn't have the "green thing" back then.

Back then, they had one electrical outlet in a room, not an entire bank of sockets to power a dozen appliances. And they didn't need a computerized gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites 2,000 miles out in space in order to find the nearest pizza joint.

But isn't it sad the current generation laments how wasteful the old folks were just because they did not have the "green thing" back then.



- if married, must be married validly in the Catholic Church
- be a practicing Catholic, regularly attending Mass & receiving Holy Communion on Sundays and Holy Days
- be an example of Christian living to the person that you are sponsoring, by the faith you profess in the Lord, His Church, and by your support and service to your parish community
